



Thank you for your interest in the Acting for Film and Digital Media program. Come and join a group of professionals who will support you in preparing to be the best actor you can be. Our Acting for Film and Digital Media program is at the forefront of developing actor/entrepreneurs and all of our faculty are working, industry professionals.

Our focus continues to be superior actor training with courses in voice, speech, movement, acting, scene study and auditioning for film and television. In light of the evolving nature of media, you will also study film editing, screenwriting, stunt training, voice-over acting, self-marketing and acting with technology (eg. Green screen), with an emphasis on creating your own work.

In order to be admitted into the program please take note of the following in order to assist you in understanding the selection process.

Please carefully review the following information:

Audition process

- Entrance to our program requires a successfully adjudicated audition which is Theatre, Film and Digital Media Industry standard protocol. We currently have 2 options for live, in person, auditions on Saturday February 7th, 2026, or Saturday April 18th, 2026 (Niagara College, Welland Campus). We will also have multiple options for live, virtual auditions between January and May 2026. Please check the www.niagaracollege.ca/preacting for all audition date/time registration:
- For your audition, memorize one contemporary monologue that is one and a half to two minutes in length. It can be from a play, a movie, television or other digital media show. Please use a pre-written piece (not self-written). It should be age appropriate and prepare for the possibility we may give you feedback or an adjustment and ask to see it again in the live, or virtual live, audition.
- There will also be an interview process speaking to your desire to study in this kind of full-time program as well as info about your monologue piece such as who wrote it and why it resonated with you. We would also like to hear a bit about your history, previous acting or creative experience and where you are currently based.
- NOTE* Participation at one of these sessions is a requirement, however, applicants who live outside of Canada may follow instructions below for electronic submission instead. Additionally, after May 2026 if there are still spots available in the program after the live and virtual auditions are complete you may also submit electronically. If there are other special considerations regarding the audition requirements, please contact the faculty below.

OR: How to submit your electronic audition if outside of Canada or after May 2026 (see above recommendations)

Electronic Audition (if necessary)	<p>Simply record your two, memorized, monologue audition pieces in a single shot where we can see you clearly (Medium to Medium Close up shot of head and upper body). Please record landscape not portrait if on a smart phone. Speak a brief introduction (what the source of the audition piece is, the role you are playing and why you are performing it) for each piece. Upload the completed pieces to YouTube (unlisted) and send the YouTube link to: acting@niagaracollege.ca. Admission Requirements:

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), or equivalent, including the following required course:
 - English – any Grade 12 (C) or (U), or equivalent
- Completion of a successful audition (as determined by the college)
- Proof of English language proficiency, where applicable

Selection Criteria:

Admission decisions will be made based on your audition score along with proof of your Grade 12 English at the C or U level, or equivalent.

Acceptance using Mid-term grades are conditional until final grades are received.
